


What We Believe

The Articles of Faith in the Baptist Church

I. The Scriptures. We believe that the Holy Bible was written by men divinely inspired, and is a perfect treasure of heavenly instruction; that it has God for its author, salvation for its end, and truth without any mixture of error for its matter; that it reveals the principles by which God will judge us, and therefore is, and shall remain to the end of the world, the true center of Christian union, and the supreme standard by which all human conduct, creeds, and opinions shall be tried.

II. The True God. We believe the Scriptures teach that there is one, and only one, living and true God, an infinite, intelligent Spirit, whose name is Jehovah, the Maker and Supreme Ruler of heaven and earth; inexpressibly glorious in holiness, and worthy of all possible honor confidence and love; that in the unity of the Godhead there are three persons, the Father, the Son, and the Holy Ghost; equal in every divine perfection, and executing distinct but harmonious offices in the great work of redemption.

III. The Fall of Man. We believe the Scriptures teach that Man was created in holiness, under the law of his Maker; but by voluntary transgressions fell from that holy and happy state; in consequence of which all mankind are now sinners, not by constraint but choice; being by nature utterly void of that holiness required by the law of God, positively inclined to evil; and therefore under just condemnation to eternal ruin, without defense or excuse.

IV. The Way of Salvation. We believe that the Scriptures teach that the salvation of sinners is wholly of grace; through the mediatorial offices of the Son of God; who by the appointment of the Father, freely took upon him our nature, yet without sin; honored the divine law by his personal obedience, and by his death made a full atonement for our sins; that having risen from the dead, he is now enthroned in heaven; and uniting in his wonderful person the tenderest sympathies with divine perfections, he is in every way qualified to be a suitable, a compassionate, and an all-sufficient Savior.

V. Justification. We believe the Scriptures teach that the great Gospel blessing which Christ secures to such as believe in him is justification; that justification includes the pardon of sin, and the promise of eternal life on principles of righteousness; that it is bestowed, not in consideration of any works of righteousness which we have done, but solely through faith in the Redeemer's blood; by virtue of which faith his perfect righteousness is freely imputed to us of God; that it brings us into a state of most blessed peace and favor with God, and secures every other blessing needful for time and eternity.

VI. The Freeness of Salvation. We believe that the Scriptures teach that the blessings of salvation are made free to all by the Gospel; that it is the immediate duty of all to accept them by cordial, penitent and obedient faith; and that nothing prevents the salvation of the greatest sinner on earth, but his own determined depravity and voluntary rejection of the Gospel; which rejection involves him in an aggravated condemnation.

VII. Regeneration. We believe that the Scriptures teach that in order to be saved, sinners must be regenerated, or born again; that regeneration consists in giving a holy disposition to the mind that it is effected in a manner above our comprehension by the power of the Holy Spirit in connection with divine truth, so as to secure our voluntary obedience to the Gospel; and that its proper evidence appears in the holy fruits of repentance and faith, and newness of life.

VIII. Repentance and Faith. We believe the Scriptures teach that repentance and faith are sacred duties, and also inseparable graces, wrought in our souls by the regenerating Spirit of God; whereby being deeply convinced of our guilt, danger and helplessness and of the way of salvation by Christ, we turn to God with unfeigned contrition, confession, and supplication for mercy; at the same time heartily receiving the Lord Jesus Christ as our prophet, priest and king, and relying on him alone as the only and all-sufficient Savior.

IX. God's Purpose of Grace. We believe the Scriptures teach that election is the eternal purpose of God, according to which he graciously regenerates, sanctifies and saves sinners; that being perfectly consistent with the free agency of man, it comprehends all the means in connection with the end; that it is a most glorious display of God's sovereign goodness, being infinitely free, wise, holy and unchangeable; that it utterly excludes boasting and promotes humility, love, prayer, praise, trust in God, and active imitation of his free mercy; that it encourages the use of means in the highest degree; that it may be ascertained by its effects in all who truly believe the Gospel; that it is the foundation of Christian assurance; and that to ascertain it with regard to ourselves demands and deserves the utmost diligence.

X. Sanctification. We believe the Scriptures teach that Sanctification is the process by which, according to the will of God, we are made partakers of his holiness; that it is a progressive work; that it is begun in regeneration; and that it is carried on in the hearts of believers by the presence and power of the Holy Spirit, the Sealer and Comforter, in the continual use of the appointed means especially the word of God, self-examination, self-denial, watchfulness, and prayer.

XI. Perseverance of the Saints. We believe the Scriptures teach that such only are real believers as endure to the end; that their persevering attachment to Christ is the grand mark which distinguishes them from superficial professors; that a special Providence watches over their welfare; and they are kept by the power of God through faith unto salvation.

XII. The Law and Gospel. We believe the Scriptures teach that the Law of God is the eternal and unchangeable rule of his moral government; that it is holy, just and good; and that the inability which the Scriptures ascribe to fallen men to fulfill its precepts, arise entirely from their love of sin; to deliver them from which, and to restore them through a Mediator to unfeigned obedience to the holy Law, is one great end of the Gospel, and of the Means of Grace connected with the establishment of the visible church.

XIII. A Gospel Church. We believe the Scriptures teach that a visible church of Christ is a congregation of baptized believers, associated by covenant in the faith and fellowship of the Gospel; observing the ordinances of Christ; governed by his laws; and exercising the gifts, rights, and privileges invested in them by His Word; that its only scriptural officers are Bishops or Pastors, and Deacons whose Qualifications, claims and duties are defined in the Epistles to Timothy and Titus.

XIV. Baptism and the Lord's Supper. We believe the Scriptures teach that Christian baptism is the immersion in water of a believer, into the name of the Father, and Son, and Holy Ghost; to show forth in a solemn and beautiful emblem, our faith in the crucified, buried, and risen Savior, with its effect, in our death to sin and resurrection to a new life; that it is prerequisite to the privileges of a church relation; and to the Lord's Supper, in which the members of the church, by the sacred use of bread and wine, are to commemorate together the dying love of Christ; preceded always by solemn self-examination.

XV. The Christian Sabbath. We believe the Scriptures teach that the first day of the week is the Lord's Day, or Christian Sabbath, and is to be kept sacred to religious purposes, by abstaining from all secular labor and sinful recreations, by the devout observance of all the means of grace, both private and public, and by preparation for that rest that remained for the people of God.

XVI. Civil Government. We believe the Scriptures teach that civil government is of divine appointment, for the interest and good order of human society; and that magistrates are to be prayed for, conscientiously honored, and obeyed; except only in things opposed to the will of our Lord Jesus Christ, who is the only Lord of the conscience, and the Prince of the Kings of the earth.

XVII. Righteous and Wicked. We believe the Scriptures teach that there is a radical and essential difference between the righteous and the wicked; that such only as through faith are justified in the name of the Lord Jesus, and sanctified by the Spirit of our God, are truly righteous in his esteem; while all such as continue in impenitence and unbelief are in his sight wicked, and under the curse; and this distinction holds among men both in and after death.

XVIII. The World to Come. We believe the Scriptures teach that the end of the world is approaching; that at the last day, Christ will descend from heaven, and raise the dead from the grave for final retribution; that a solemn separation will then take place; that the wicked will be adjudged to endless punishment, and the righteous to endless joy; and that this judgment will fix forever the final state of men in heaven or hell, on principles of righteousness.



Wilmington University President Dr. LaVerne Harmon Selected as Delaware Business Times' First Person of the Year

“The Delaware Business Times created the Person of the Year to feature and spotlight one person who has done the most to influence Delaware’s economy in a particular year,” says Katie Tabeling, editor of Delaware Business Times. “In a state with 222 impactful leaders, we decided to highlight one of them who stood head and shoulders above the rest.”

They chose Wilmington University President **Dr. LaVerne Harmon** as the publication’s first Person of the Year, an honor introduced in its Delaware 222 supplement. As its name suggests, Delaware 222 recognizes 222 of Delaware’s most influential business, nonprofit and civic leaders. Being singled out from among this accomplished group as the inaugural Person of the Year underscores the reach and significance of Dr. Harmon’s work and the University’s economic impact on the First State.

According to Tabeling, the Delaware Business Times sought leaders who delivered strong results over the past year or introduced game-changing products or services. The selection committee also weighed nominees’ successes in leading transformations with strong outcomes and in expanding their organization’s reach or overall impact on Delaware’s economy.

Under Dr. Harmon’s leadership, Wilmington University has expanded educational access for students of all ages and backgrounds, many of whom live and work in Delaware. Through a wide range of new or enhanced programs, WilmU graduates serve as educators, health care professionals, public safety officials, IT specialists and business and community leaders whose daily contributions strengthen the state’s workforce and quality of life. A focus on opportunity, student success, and strong community partnerships—and her consistent advocacy for collaborative teams that bring faculty, staff, and community partners together on behalf of students—have defined her tenure.

As an example of the promise WilmU offers, Dr. Harmon worked her way up from being assistant to the president to president herself, reflecting the same commitment to accessibility and advancement that defines the University’s mission.

“In our first year naming a Person of the Year, our team selected Dr. Harmon not only because she is blazing a trail with innovative programs—such as the state’s first nurse anesthesiology program and a new, high-

demand law school—but also because, behind the scenes and throughout her career at WilmU, she has helped shape the University’s mission of creating affordable education and upskilling options for Delawareans of all ages,” says Tabeling. “As an example of the promise WilmU offers, Dr. Harmon worked her way up from being assistant to the president to president herself, reflecting the same commitment to accessibility and advancement that defines the University’s mission.”

Dr. Harmon’s recognition was first announced at the inaugural Delaware 222 reception at the Delaware Art Museum on December 3, 2025. She offered words of thanks to the Delaware Business Times and Today Media teams and acknowledged the leaders named to the 222 list. The moment reflected Dr. Harmon’s many achievements and Wilmington University’s role as a key partner in Delaware’s growth and future.

When the church takes digital protection seriously, it reflects the command to care for the flock and to avoid giving place to the devil through carelessness, remembering that “Be sober, be vigilant; because your adversary the devil, as a roaring lion, walketh about, seeking whom he may devour,” 1Peter 5:8 (KJV). Guarding against data breaches and online scams is part of wise, loving oversight of the congregation.

At Canaan, teaching about cybersecurity and data breaches shows that digital life is not separate from discipleship. God has entrusted His people with tithes, offerings, prayer requests, and personal testimonies, and “Moreover it is required in stewards, that a man be found faithful,” 1Corinthians 4:2 (KJV). Protecting information is one way to walk honestly and to “Recompense to no man evil for evil. Provide things honest in the sight of all men,” Romans 12:17 (KJV). When church leaders apply strong passwords, update passwords in a timely manner, use secure networks, and train members about online fraud, they are practicing biblical stewardship of the tools that God has placed in their hands.

AI tools already influence social media, news feeds, and even Bible apps on phones and tablets. They can help with translation, scheduling, and communication, yet they can also push ungodly content, spread false teaching, and amplify confusion very quickly. God’s people are commanded to “Beloved, believe not every spirit, but try the spirits whether they are of God: because many false prophets are gone out into the world,” 1John 4:1. Comprehending cybersecurity and AI helps believers live circumspectly, guard their homes, and strengthen the witness of the church in an increasingly digital age, “See then that ye walk circumspectly, not as fools, but as wise. Redeeming the time, because the days are evil,” Ephesians 5:15-16 (KJV).





Our main subject is based on how effective our facilitators are when it comes to reacting to an individual who may have an overdose on some type of Opioids. These opioids affect the brain by binding to and activating the opioid receptors on cells that are located throughout the brain.

Because they bind to the receptors that are involved in the feelings of pain and pleasure, opioids can block pain signs. Naloxone (Narcan) is a medication that can reverse an overdose from opioids including fentanyl. Keeping this medication on hand could mean the difference between life and death. Here's an example:

On October 16, 2025, a female client came to Canaan Baptist Church in need of assistance, hoping to get a hotel voucher. During our conversation, I noticed her going in and out, nodding. It appeared that she had been using some type of narcotic--opioid, heroin, Percocet, or fentanyl. These illegal substances are categorized as semi-synthetic, or synthetic based on their origin. I asked her if she had ever used opioids. She stated that she was just tired, needing a place to stay for the night. As I continued to gently shake her, I noticed her pupils were constricted, getting smaller, her body was limp, it was hard to wake her up. She was unable to speak. I didn't detect any smell of alcohol or marijuana, nevertheless, I decided to take her to the hospital. All the signs pointed to emergency care.

On our way to Christiana Care Wilmington Hospital on 14th Street, I pulled over on 3rd and Walnut Street, parked my vehicle, pulled out two Naloxone (Narcan) sprays that contain 4mg of naloxone hydrochloride), got the attention of an adult male who was talking on his phone, I called out to him, "Call 911! Call 911! I have a young

lady that's on the brink of losing her life!" Her body had gone limp in the back seat of my vehicle.

Here we can see that the drugs are having a negative impact, spiritually, emotionally, mentally, and financially. They may be adversely affecting marriage, family life, or career. If the desire to obtain and use opioids is consuming your thoughts or you are planning your life and activities around them, these are signs that you need to seek help. Addicts have a disease, an addictive personality, and a genetic predisposition to chemical dependence. The truth is that anyone can become addicted to a substance. Ed Welch states in his book, "Addictions: A Banquet in the Grave", "The Biblical View of Drunkenness – the prototype of all addictions – is that it is always called sin, never sickness. Drunkenness is against God and his law."

As with any addiction, at its root is a heart issue. Consider what you are willing to do or say to obtain the drug. Are you willing to sin by lying, cheating, stealing or by threatening and manipulating others? Because addiction is a moral problem, a worship disorder, it relies on the Word of God to address the sinful desires of the heart. Ephesians 5:18 says, "And do not get drunk with wine, for that is debauchery, but be filled with the Spirit..."

As I gently reached for her, trying to wake her up, still unable to speak, I used one 4mg. N.N.S], in the left nostril, I waited between 3-5 minutes; while waiting for her to respond from the spray, I asked the adult male if the paramedics were on their way. He said yes. She had a pulse, still no response. I immediately gave her a second dose of naloxone (Narcan). Five minutes later, the paramedics arrived, and at that same time, she came to herself. After the paramedics finished questioning her to find out if she was aware of her surroundings, they suggested that she come with them for a thorough evaluation. She agreed to their suggestion--Mission Accomplished!

Therapy: Uncovering what you may or may not know about how alcohol and drugs have a profound effect on a family member's mental, physical spiritual, emotional, and financial state of mind.

What are opioids? Opioids are a class of drugs that includes prescription pain relievers such as oxycodone, hydrocodone, codeine, morphine, and fentanyl..

Medication Assisted Treatment (MAT) is the use of medication in combination with behavioral counseling to treat opioid addiction. There are three drugs approved by the FDA for the treatment of opioid dependence: buprenorphine, methadone, and naltrexone. These drugs, considered to be “essential medicines” by the World Health Organization (WHO) or the treatment of Opioid Use Disorder, must be prescribed by and under the supervision of a physician.

Addiction from the World’s Perspective

“Many people don’t understand why or how other people become addicted to drugs. They may mistakenly think that those who use drugs lack moral principles or willpower and that they could stop their drug use simply by choosing to. Drug addiction is a complex disease, and quitting takes more than good intentions or a strong will.” Our society claims that addiction is a physical disease. According to Wikipedia, addiction is “a brain disorder characterized by compulsive engagement in rewarding stimuli despite adverse consequences.”

Twelve-Step Facilitation Therapy includes support groups such as Alcoholics Anonymous and Narcotics Anonymous. Twelve-step programs teach that alcoholism and addiction are chronic, progressive diseases. The substance abuser acknowledges that life has become out of control due to their drug use, accepts that willpower alone is not enough to overcome their need for the substance, and is willing to surrender to a higher power in order to remain abstinent from it. Active involvement in the 12-step meetings and accountability to their sponsor






still holds back, and the mystery of a long-lost child challenge everything the siblings thought they knew about their lineage and themselves.


