

### SBA relief available to small businesses, private nonprofits

DOVER — The U.S. Small Business Administration issued a reminder to small businesses and private nonprofit organizations in Delaware, Pennsylvania and New Jersey of the Dec. 8 deadline to apply for low interest federal disaster loans to offset economic losses caused by the drought occurring April 1, 2025.

The disaster declaration covers the counties of Kent and New Castle in Delaware; Atlantic, Burlington, Camden, Cape May, Cumberland, Gloucester, Ocean and Salem in New Jersey; as well as Delaware and Philadelphia in Pennsylvania.

Under this declaration, the SBA's Economic Injury Disaster Loan can be used for working capital needs caused by the disaster and is available even if the business or PNP did not suffer any physical damage.

### Churches Turn to Chatbot Jesus as Pews Go Empty

AI is slipping into the pulpit as 'Chatbot Jesus' apps spread through churches searching for new ways to reach dwindling congregations. From automated prayers to pastor-built bots, religious life is getting a digital rewrite.

Axios reports that pastors, megachurches, and faith-focused startups are adopting AI tools to draft sermons and even simulate conversations with Jesus and other biblical figures as attendance drops and closures rise.

### A nation of empty pews

US churches are facing their steepest decline in decades. Attendance is dropping, staff are stretched thin, and thousands of congregations are expected to close this year. Axios notes that nearly one in three Americans now identifies as religiously unaffiliated, a demographic shift that's reshaping Sunday mornings nationwide.

Megachurches continue to swell, but smaller parishes are struggling to keep pace. Even the biggest campuses can't offer the individual attention many worshippers once received, leaving pastors juggling crowds they can't meaningfully reach.

In that climate, some churches are turning to technology simply to keep people engaged. AI tools let pastors stay present when fewer members show up in person. For ministries trying to hold on to their communities, every connection counts.

### Algorithms behind the altar

Across the country, churches are rolling out AI systems to handle everyday questions that once swamped front desks and volunteer teams. Chatbots now answer queries about service schedules, event logistics, and quick scripture references, acting as on-call guides for members who expect instant replies.

Some churches are also adopting software that studies attendance patterns and engagement habits, flagging when outreach might be needed. These tools were once niche experiments; they're now becoming part of routine ministry planning.

For pastors, AI is showing up in more practical corners of the job. Several told Axios they use it to organize tasks and streamline communications, cutting hours off their weekly prep work.

Rev. Chris Hope, founder of the Hope Group, said the technology can boost "scheduling, coordination of preaching engagements and missions work," and argued that churches "haven't tapped the surface" of what responsible AI could support.

### From Amen to AI-men

One corner of this technological shift is unfolding in people's phones, where a new class of spiritual chat tools is taking shape. Text With Jesus is among the most prominent, inviting users into message-style exchanges with Jesus, Mary, Joseph, and other biblical figures, complete with verse references and character-based replies.

Catholic developers are moving in the same direction. Several confession and reflection apps now guide users through pre-confessional questions and spiritual check-ins, using scripture to shape each prompt and helping worshippers prepare before speaking with a priest.

Personality-driven tools are growing alongside them. Megachurch pastor Ron Carpenter, for example, offers a digital version of himself for subscribers seeking one-on-one interactions, and Rev. Louis Attles relies on his bot "Faith" to help comb through research for his weekly sermons.

Other Christ-themed apps are gaining momentum as well. Virtual Jesus and Ask Jesus both provide round-the-clock responses modeled on the teachings of Christ, giving users quick scripture references, encouragement, and conversational guidance.

### The fight against synthetic spirituality

Some church leaders are increasingly uneasy about the surge of spiritual chatbots that sound like clergy — or claim to speak in the voice of Jesus.

Researchers and pastors worry users may not know what sources these tools rely on or how their answers are being shaped. Robert P. Jones of the Public Religion Research Institute warned that many apps don't disclose whether they draw from standard Bible translations, early church teachings, or narrowly ideological material.

Those concerns are amplified when chatbots begin to mimic divine or pastoral authority. Mark Graves of AI and Faith told Axios that many developers are racing to release products before establishing guardrails, saying "the risks are very high."

Questions about digital tools have reached the highest levels of the Church as well. Pope Leo XIV rejected a proposal for a "virtual pope," calling the idea "horrifying" and insisting that an avatar or automated assistant cannot duplicate core duties of the papacy.

For all the convenience these systems offer, their rise forces churches to decide what must remain unmistakably human. Not every message can be handed to a machine, especially when the authority behind the words is the point.

At a meeting on AI and medicine in Vatican City, Pope Leo XIV stressed that technological progress in healthcare should never come at the expense of human connection.

### Faithful Stewardship in a Digital World: Comprehending Cybersecurity and Artificial Intelligence (AI)



Cybersecurity and AI may sound like difficult terms, but they touch everyday life for many Christians. Cybersecurity simply means keeping computers, phones, and church systems safe from people who try to steal or damage information. It is like locking the church doors at

night, but in the digital world, so that personal data, giving records, and messages stay protected and used for godly purposes. AI describes computer programs that can learn from large amounts of information and then make suggestions, answer questions, or create text and images. AI does not think or feel like a person, but it can copy patterns it has been given and respond in helpful or harmful ways.

For Christians, these tools raise questions about stewardship, truth, and human dignity before God. Stewardship means using time, talent, money, and technology in ways that honor the Lord and serve others, not wasting these gifts or using them for sin. Truth matters because online spaces and AI systems can spread lies, confusion, and false teaching, so believers must compare messages to the Bible and sound doctrine. Human dignity must be protected, because every person in Wilmington, DE, and beyond is made in the image of God and should never be treated as data to exploit or a product to manipulate. The Church needs to comprehend cybersecurity and AI so that technology is a servant, not an idol, never trusted more than the Lord Jesus, and never allowed to replace prayer, the Scriptures, worship, or the work of the Holy Spirit.







### CANAAN OVERCOMERS OUTREACH MINISTRY

During the months of September through November, The Overcomers Ministry celebrated three anniversaries--14 years, 25, years, and 35 years, Congratulations!

Our main subject is based on how effective our facilitators

are when it comes to reacting to an individual who may have an overdose on some type of Opioids. These opioids affect the brain by binding to and activating the opioid receptors on cells that are located throughout the brain. Because they bind to the receptors that are involved in the feelings of pain and pleasure, opioids can block pain sign. Naloxone (Narcan) is a medication that can reverse an overdose from opioids including fentanyl. Keeping this medication on hand could mean the difference between life and death. Here's an example:

On October 16, 2025, a female client came to Canaan Baptist Church in need of assistance, hoping to get a hotel voucher. During our conversation, I noticed her going in and out, nodding. It appeared that she had been using some type of narcotic--opioid, heroin, Percocet, or fentanyl. These illegal substances are categorized as semi-synthetic, or synthetic based on their origin. I asked her if she had ever used opioids. She stated that she was just tired, needing a place to stay for the night. As I continued to gently shake her, I noticed her pupils were constricted, getting smaller, her body was limp, it was hard to wake her up. She was unable to speak. I didn't detect any smell of alcohol or marijuana, nevertheless, I decided to take her to the hospital. All the signs pointed to emergency care.

On our way to Christiana Care Wilmington Hospital on 14<sup>th</sup> Street, I pulled over on 3<sup>rd</sup> and Walnut Street, parked my vehicle, pulled out two Naloxone (Narcan) sprays that contain 4mg of naloxone hydrocholoride), got the attention of an

adult male who was talking on his phone, I called out to him, "Call 911! Call 911! I have a young lady that's on the brink of losing her life!" Her body had gone limp in the back seat of my vehicle.

Here we can see that the drugs are having a negative impact, spiritually, emotionally, mentally, and financially. They may be adversely affecting marriage, family life, or career. If the desire to obtain and use opioids is consuming your thoughts or you are planning your life and activities around them, these are signs that you need to seek help. Addicts have a disease, an addictive personality, and a genetic predisposition to chemical dependence. The truth is that anyone can become addicted to a substance. Ed Welch states in his book, "Addictions: A Banquet in the Grave", "The Biblical View of Drunkenness – the prototype of all addictions – is that it is always called sin, never sickness. Drunkenness is against God and his law."

As with any addiction, at its root is a heart issue. Consider what you are willing to do or say to obtain the drug. Are you willing to sin by lying, cheating, stealing or by threatening and manipulating others? Because addiction is a moral problem, a worship disorder, it relies on the Word of God to address the sinful desires of the heart. Ephesians 5:18 says, "And do not get drunk with wine, for that is debauchery, but be filled with the Spirit..."

As I gently reached for her, trying to wake her up, still unable to speak, I used one 4mg. N.N.S], in the left nostril, I waited between 3-5 minutes; while waiting for her to respond from the spray, I asked the adult male if the paramedics were on their way. He said yes. She had a pulse, still no response. I immediately gave her a second dose of naloxone (Narcan). Five minutes later, the paramedics arrived, and at that same time, she came to herself. After the paramedics finished questioning her to find out if she was aware of her surroundings, they suggested that she come with them for a thorough evaluation. She agreed to their suggestion--Mission Accomplished!

Therapy: Uncovering what you may or may not know about how alcohol and drugs have a profound effect on a family member's mental, physical spiritual, emotional, and financial state of mind.

Twelve-Step Facilitation Therapy focuses on the clinical as well as the spiritual. Ephesians 5:18 says, "And be not drunk with wine, wherein is excess; but be filled with the spirit. (KJV).

It's no accident that alcoholic beverages are often called "spirits." Why? Because the feeling many people want alcohol to give them is ultimately spiritual, joy, freedom, serenity, contentment. But as we know, the way to find that feeling is to be filled not with "spirits," but with the Holy Spirit of God. (Life Connection)

What are opioids? Opioids are a class of drugs that includes prescription pain relievers such as oxycodone, hydrocodone, codeine, morphine, and fentanyl. Naturally found in the opium poppy plant, these natural or synthetic drugs are chemically related to the illegal drug, heroin.

Medication Assisted Treatment (MAT) is the use of medication in combination with behavioral counseling to treat opioid addiction. There are three drugs approved by the FDA for the treatment of opioid dependence: buprenorphine, methadone, and naltrexone. These drugs, considered to be "essential medicines" by the World Health Organization (WHO) or the treatment of Opioid Use Disorder, must be prescribed by and under the supervision of a physician.

### Please be mindful that these are real life situations

### Sister Tojuana Green

After 3 months of training, I became a Certified Narcan Trainer with Canaan Baptist Church's Substance Abuse Ministry for Project (M.O.O.D) Multicultural Opioid Outreach, Delivery. Shortly thereafter, I had my first experience of saving a life while on the job. I was working the midnight shift at the Riverfront when I noticed a man wobbling and bent over. While someone was trying to assist him, his breathing became irregular, hard, and deep. I instantly remembered putting Narcan kits in my locker. Upon returning, I could see the signs that he had overdosed. My

training skills immediately took over, and I followed the instructions I had learned, including dialing 911 to notify them of an overdose. As he came to consciousness, thanks to my assistance, the first responders arrived and took over the situation. Before they took him to the hospital, I provided him with information on available services and resources to help him get assistance. Thank you, Canaan, for preparing us as Certified Narcan Trainers to "Impact the human condition" (Luke 4:18-19)

### Addiction from the World's Perspective

"Many people don't understand why or how other people become addicted to drugs. They may mistakenly think that those who use drugs lack moral principles or willpower and that they could stop their drug use simply by choosing to. Drug addiction is a complex disease, and quitting takes more than good intentions or a strong will." Our society claims that addiction is a physical disease. According to Wikipedia, addiction is "a brain disorder characterized by compulsive engagement in rewarding stimuli despite adverse consequences."

These are real life situations:

### Sister Edwina Bell

As a recovering person in the fellowship of Alcoholics Anonymous for 35+ years, I never imagined that God would prepare me to help others in unexpected ways. Having a podcast and a TV talk show, "Choosing A New Way of Life," I never know who was watching. On one episode, I received a call, while on the air, from a person wanting to commit suicide because he couldn't stop using drugs. He said he was on the floor tossing and turning, not knowing what to do; Withdrawal signs include discomfort, pain, sweating, intestinal distress, vomiting, muscle aches, depression, and anxiety, accompanied by intense cravings for the drug.

Did you know that Opioids sedate the respiratory system and carry with them a high risk of overdose that can lead to death. When he saw me on the television screen talking about how I overcame my addiction. He began to listen to what I was saying and felt it was a message from God that there is hope. He then called the station

to ask to speak to me. The control room notified me of the situation, and I immediately went to break. I listened to what the young man had to say. I told him to hold on until I got there. Through God's grace and mercy, the young man was still alive and agreed to get help, saying to me, "If he did it for you, I believe he can do it for me!" I told him about AA and Canaan Baptist Church's Substance Abuse Ministry. He has been drug-free for 5 months!

Twelve-Step Facilitation Therapy includes support groups such as Alcoholics Anonymous and Narcotics Anonymous. Twelve-step programs teach that alcoholism and addiction are chronic, progressive diseases. The substance abuser acknowledges that life has become out of control due to their drug use, accepts that willpower alone is not enough to overcome their need for the substance, and is willing to surrender to a higher power in order to remain abstinent from it. Active involvement in the 12-step meetings and accountability to their sponsor

The Canaan Overcomers Outreach Ministry will continue to seek out the rich, the poor, the sick, the lame, the good, the bad, the addict, the alcoholic, regardless of their ethnicity. We will help them to become mentally sound, physically well, emotionally adjusted, and spiritually alive. It is our mission to go ye therefore, doing Ministry for the Master. Be encouraged!




### <u>Developing Strong Black Male Ministries</u> by Dr. Jawanza Kunjufu

trends of African American males, the steps the church has taken to address these issues, and modern troubles relating to involvement in the church.


### Parable of the Brown Girl: The Sacred Lives of Girls of Color by Khristi Lauren Adams

Tis The Season by K.J. Sharpe



John 3:16a-For God so loved the world, he gave... When we think of the holiday season, we imagine a bountiful Thanksgiving with food and family, Christmas as the "season to be jolly", and new

beginnings for the New Year. We deck the halls, confess "Jesus is the reason for the season", and make resolutions to be better in some way than we were last year.

The Bible says in John 3:16 that "God so loved the world that he gave his only begotten son." It's a verse we've memorized in its entirety since we were young children in Sunday school. We repeat it so easily that we often miss the gravity of that first sentence. Do you know what it's like to give up the only precious thing of value, that one-of-a-kind, irreplaceable thing to strangers so their lives can be enriched? Have you ever done that? Done it without regret? Without checking to see if the person took care of the gift you gave. For God so loved the world, he gave.

The Christ child came into the world on a dark night, his parents likely anxious and exhausted from travel and the political and social pressures brought about by Caesar Agustus' tax audit. Unhoused, they landed in Bethlehem, a small remote town known for its agriculture and shepherding. There, in a cave, at around 15 years old, Mary gave birth to her first-born son. She wrapped him in swaddling clothes and laid him in his first crib, a trough used to feed horses and cattle. It wasn't a holiday for baby Jesus and his family.

When I was three years old, I lost my father on Thanksgiving Day. With that loss came decades of undiagnosed depression. I powered through for years, contemplating and planning suicide at ages 13, 16, 25, and 39 before seeing a therapist at 40. She told me I'd be fine because I had the right

tools. I was smart, strategic, a black woman. I could handle it. In the ten years following, I lost my bonus father, my best friend, my younger brother (who I called my twin because he was born on my birthday six years after me), and, lastly, my first-born son. I knew the scripture, "For God so loved the world he gave", but I felt like God had taken everything I loved and valued. The whole world looked dark to me. Religion couldn't reach me. I couldn't find the words or a reason to pray. I had been a worshipper but the sound of music hurt like a knife cutting into my brain. I hated it. Holidays were insufferable, agonizing reminders that the people I loved were gone. Forever.

For God so loved the world, he gave. The town of Bethlehem, though small, was known as the "House of Bread", a place where people the world over came for sustenance. As Jesus lay in his makeshift crib, a brilliant star led three wealthy wise men to his side, presenting him and his family with expensive gifts. Frankincenserepresenting divinity, myrrh-symbolic suffering, and gold -representing both kingship and divinity. These gifts, all used in worship and in ancient worship rituals, helped Jesus' family properly care for him as he grew to manhood.
