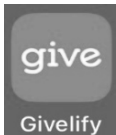

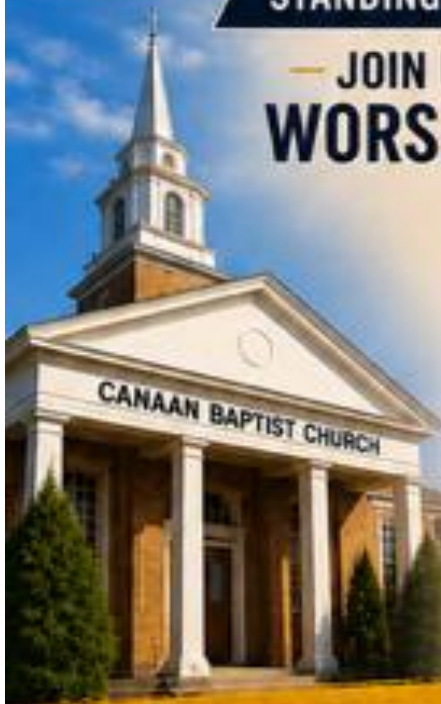

Reverend David Eugene Penn, Sr. DMin



Reverend David Eugene Penn, Sr. presently serves as the Senior Pastor of the Mount Bethel Missionary Baptist Church located in the city of New Haven, Connecticut. In his previous ministerial/pastoral assignments Reverend Penn has served with humility and distinction as the Senior Pastor of the following churches: Third Baptist Church located in Suffield Connecticut, Macedonia Baptist Church in Ansonia Connecticut, and the Mount Pleasant Baptist Church in Pleasantville New Jersey. He has also served as an Associate Minister at the Fifth Baptist Church in Richmond Virginia and the Grace Baptist Church in Norwalk Connecticut.

Reverend Penn was born in Harlem New York. He received his Doctor of Ministry degree from the Leonard N. Smith School of Religion at the Virginia University of Lynchburg, graduating as a Leonard N. Smith Fellow. Reverend Penn received his Master of Divinity degree from the Samuel DeWitt Proctor School of Theology at Virginia Union University where he graduated with honors. He attended the College of New Rochelle and is a graduate of the New York Theological Seminary where he received his Certificate of Christian Ministry. Reverend Penn has also been awarded honorary doctoral degrees from the following institutions: Richmond Virginia Seminary, Eastern Theological Seminary, and the New Freedom Bible College.

Reverend Penn has been actively involved in ministry for Forty-Four years. He was licensed to preach in 1982 and ordained to the gospel ministry in 1988 at the New Mount Zion Baptist Church in Harlem New York under the pastoral leadership of the late Dr. Edward L. Satchell. Reverend Penn has been involved in pastoral ministry for the last thirty-Four years.

Reverend Penn is presently serving as the President of the Connecticut State Missionary Baptist Convention. He the former Moderator of the Levite Association an auxiliary of the Connecticut State Missionary Baptist Convention. In his previous positions Reverend Penn as also served the Convention as Chief of Staff, Assistant Dean, State Dean of the Congress of Christian Education and the Field Representative for the Committee on Higher Education. Reverend is a member of the faculty of the National Baptist Congress of Christian Education serving as Director General and he is a Certified Instructor for the Sunday School Publishing Board of the National Baptist Convention, USA, Inc. Reverend Penn has also received the Certificate in Church Administration from the Institute of Church Administration at the Interdenominational Theological Center in Atlanta Georgia.

Reverend Penn has been married for the last thirty-Eight years to the Reverend Tracye Colette-Chisholm Penn. They are the proud Parents of five adult children and wonderful grandchildren and beautiful great-grandchildren.

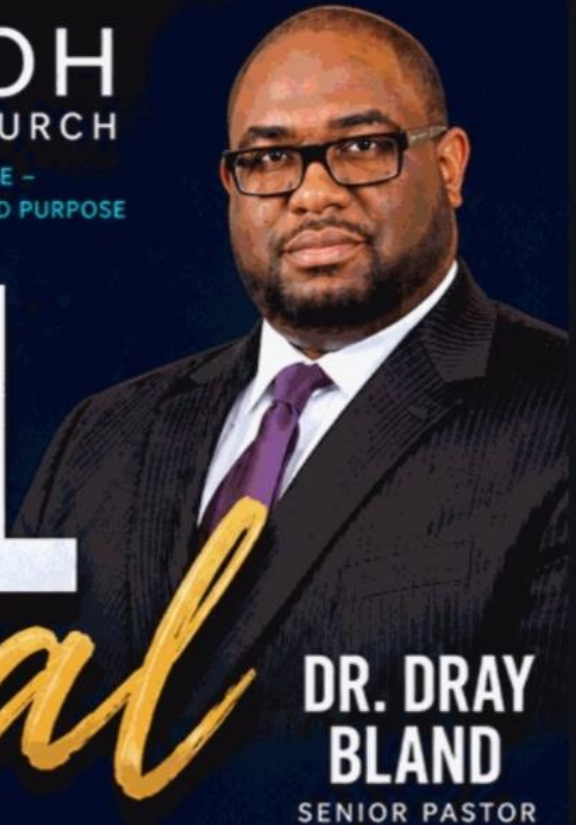

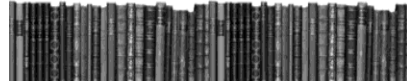

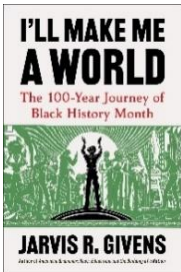

I'll Make Me a World: The 100-Year Journey of Black History Month

by Jarvis R. Givens



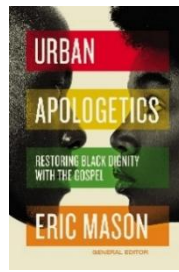
In *I'll Make Me a World*, acclaimed Harvard scholar Jarvis R. Givens takes us on a personal and political journey through the 100-year history of Black History Month—from its radical beginnings in 1926 as “Negro History Week” to its role today as a celebration and flashpoint in America’s cultural battles. Drawing on archival research, personal stories involving family and students, and especially the wisdom of Black educators, Givens recovers the legacy of Carter G. Woodson and many others who envisioned Black history as a liberatory force—knowledge that shapes who we are, how we resist, and what we dream.

With striking clarity, Givens challenges today’s myopic commemorations of iconic figures and urges us to expand our understanding of Black history to include the everyday lives of ordinary people—the “workadays” whose stories have long gone untold but form critical parts of Black history. Indeed, people who played important roles in passing on Black memories that helped disrupt oppressively narrow perspectives on human life. Givens also attend to the labor involved in preserving Black history, especially in intellectual environments where it is constantly denigrated and undervalued, and he insists that more transparency in such processes is necessary to ensure this worthy tradition is passed on to future generations.

I'll Make Me A World is a call to remember, reimagine, and reclaim an intellectual tradition built by communities well before our time, and to take seriously what is politically at stake in its preservation. At a time when Black history is under attack, this book offers an inspiring vision

for how it can still be a source of power, truth, and possibility.

Urban Apologetics: Restoring Black Dignity with the Gospel

African Americans have long confronted the challenge of dignity destruction caused by white supremacy. While many have found meaning and restoration of dignity in the black church, others have found it in ethnocentric socioreligious groups and philosophies.

These ideologies have grown and developed deep traction in the black community and beyond. Revisionist history, conspiracy theories, and misinformation about Jesus and Christianity are the order of the day. Many young African Americans are disinterested in Christianity, and others are leaving the church in search of what these false religious ideas appear to offer, a spirituality more indigenous to their history and ethnicity.

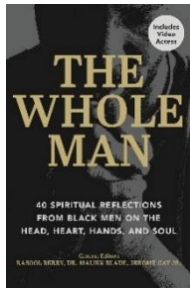

Honoring Strength, Inspiring Hope: Prostate Cancer Awareness



Prostate Cancer is one of the most common cancers affecting men, but early detection can make a significant difference. This month, let's encourage the men in our lives to learn about their risk, talk with their healthcare provider, and stay informed about screening options. Early awareness can save lives. Know the signs, know your risk and act.

According to the American Cancer Society's 2026 estimates, about 333,830 men in the United States will be diagnosed with prostate cancer and about 36,320 will die from the disease. Prostate cancer is the most commonly diagnosed cancer among American men, excluding skin cancer, and the second-leading cause of cancer death among men, after lung cancer (American Cancer Society)

UNDERSTANDING YOUR RISK

Black men in the United States have a higher risk of developing and dying from prostate cancer. The American Cancer Society reports that incidence is about 70% higher among Black men. Black men are over twice as likely to die from prostate cancers, and they have the highest prostate death rate of any racial or ethnic group. This disparity highlights the importance of access to care and the timely discussion about early detection. (American Cancer Society)



Recognize Possible Symptoms

These symptoms can have causes other than cancer, but new or persistent changes should not be ignored a healthcare professional can

determine whether testing or further evaluation is needed.

Screening Requires an Informed Decision



A prostate-specific antigen (PSA) test is a blood test that measures a protein produced by prostate cells. Screenings may include a PSA test, with additional evaluation based on a man's age, risk factors, PSA level and medical condition. Screening may help detect cancer early.

September we recognize:



Thyroid cancer the most common endocrine cancer.



Ovarian Cancer the seventh most common cancer and the fifth leading cause of cancer death among women in the United States.



Childhood Cancer the number one cause of death by disease among children, each year in the U.S.



Uterine Cancer the most common type of gynecologic cancer and most frequently occurs in women over the age of 45, though it can affect younger women.



Lymphoma cancer which affects the lymphatic system, which is made up of lymph glands throughout the body.



Leukemia cancer the 10th most common cancer in the United States, and it's the most common cancer affecting teens and children.

Malicious or Compromised Websites

This month, September, we will discuss malicious



or compromised websites. A malicious website is built by criminals to harm visitors. A compromised website is a normally safe site that has been secretly broken into and changed. Simply visiting

these sites can cause harmful software to download in the background onto your computer or phone. Common indicators of compromised websites include:

- **Unexpected pop-ups or ads**, specifically ones that appear aggressive, inappropriate, or unrelated to the site's purpose.
- **Strange redirects**, where the site abruptly sends you to another page you did not click.
- **Security warnings from your browser**, such as "This site may be unsafe" or "Your connection is not private."
- **Pages that look broken or altered**, with missing images, odd text, or unfamiliar buttons.
- **Requests to download files you did not ask for**, mainly if they appear automatically.
- **A web address (URL) that looks slightly wrong**, such as misspellings or extra characters.

This topic is very significant because we often trust what we see on the screen. If a website looks "official," we may click without thinking. Hidden code on a bad site can infect your device, steal your data, or spy on your online activity. Church members who click unsafe links can accidentally spread problems to friends and church contacts.

Church members can protect themselves by typing website addresses directly instead of clicking on unknown links. Look for simple signs of trust, such as correct spelling in the web address and avoiding pages filled with pop-ups or shocking offers. Use an updated browser and security software that can block many dangerous sites. If a link in an email or text looks strange, do not click it. Ask first!
